






County Funds \$3.2 M



Each County \$1 Leveraged \$5 in Matching Funds

Eligible Applicants

- Cumberland County municipalities
 - A private entity can partner with a municipality
- Non-Profit with 501(c)3 status

Major Changes for 2025

- Remove Water Resource Management
- Remove Ordinance Assistance

Types of Grants

- Land Acquisition
- Parks, Trails and Greenway Development
- Conservation & Recreation Planning

Land Acquisition

- Eligible expenses:
 - Purchase price of land or easement:
 - Working Farmland
 - ➤ Natural Resource Protection
 - > Parkland
 - > Greenways & Trails
 - Legal Fees, Appraisals, Survey, Title Insurance, etc.
- Applications must include an appraisal
- Land must be restricted in perpetuity
- Public access is desirable
- \$100K Max request

Park, Trails & Greenway Development

- Eligible expenses:
 - Labor and materials for site improvements and amenities
 - Equipment and capital purchases
 - Design and engineering
- Applications must include quotes or cost estimates from an engineer/architect
- \$100K Max request

Conservation & Recreation Planning

- Eligible expenses = professional consulting fees for:
 - Park, Recreation and Open Space Plan
 - Park Master Plan
 - Trail Feasibility Study
 - Property Management Plan
- Multi-Municipal plans given funding priority; local match reduced to 30%
- \$25K Max request

Funding/Awards

- Source: Act 13, Marcellus Shale Legacy Fund
- \$650,000 currently available + pending 2025 allocation (available by July 1, 2026)
- Range of Awards: \$5K \$75K
- Typical Awards: \$20K \$40K

Match

- Generally 50% county 50% other
- Multi-municipal plans up to 70% county 30% other
- Match can be federal, state, local, non-profit or private
- Cash and in-kind allowed

Application Process

- Pre Application meeting required
 - Site visit, office meeting or phone call depending on the project
- Online Application

Schedule

- Two rounds planned
 - Rd 1 Deadline = December 12
 - Rd 2 Deadline = June 26
- Grant awards announced in approximately 90 days
